## Falling Snowflakes

## Supply List:

- background fabric
- stash yarns, perle cottons, embroidery floss, metallic threads, etc.
- crewel needle appropriate for chosen threads and yarns
- 6" embroidery hoop
- white or light colored chalk pencil, crayon, marker to draw snowflake on fabric
- optional: beads, buttons, sequins, etc. for embellishment

## Directions:

- I. Find the center of the fabric and make a small mark.
- 2. Cut your circle pattern and mark the six points of the snowflake matching up the center of the fabric and the paper pattern.
- 3. Using the six outside marks of your snowflake, draw the 3 lines to develop the foundation of the snowflake. The snowflake can be made any size.
- 4. Using the provided designs or creating an original snowflake, draw the entire design on the fabric.
- 5. Begin stitching the snowflake using various threads with any embroidery stitches. These may include: straight stitches, bullion knots, French knots, lazy daisy stitch, chain stitch, running stitch, etc.
- 6. Have fun creating an original snowflake. Optional: embellish with buttons, beads, sequins, etc.
- 7. Finishing the snowflake in various techniques: an ornament, a framed piece, add to tote bag, etc.
